DEHUMIDIFIER PROJECT

The Maintenance and Utilities team has been hard at work installing more than 20 new dehumidifiers in selected residence halls' lounge rooms, laundry rooms, and break areas. These devices, which can remove more than 8 gallons of water daily from the air, help improve the quality of air by removing the excess moisture. About 90 percent of the project is complete, with many of the devices already working above ceiling tile or inside cabinets.



REYNOLDS GYM: PHASE 2 COMPLETE

After more than a year of construction, Phase 2 of Reynolds Gym has opened its doors to the campus community as a center for fitness/wellbeing. This area of the building features over 18,000 square-feet of cardio and strength training areas, including over 60 cardio machines, free weights, and weight training equipment. The new indoor rock climbing wall features 10 rope lanes and numerous surfaces for a variety of skill levels.

SUSTAINABILITY INITIATIVE

JL Bolt, his construction team, and RL&H members (Frank Shelton and Wesley Todd) were recognized for 'Sawstainability' in Wake Forest Stories. Out of 2,113 old bed frames that were removed from the residence halls, 61% were donated, 39% were retained for construction, and 0% were sent to the landfill. ENERGY SAVINGS

F&CS has made progress this summer on interior LED lighting conversions. Around 1,000 fixtures were converted, which should yield around \$35,000 annual energy savings.
