


#### The Tree Doctor Is In

# LED Lighting

# Upgraded over 5,000 lights to LEDs

Over 90% of lights in 11 buildings have been converted to LEDs including Benson, Reynolds Gym, Hearn Plaza residence halls, and Wait Chapel. Added sensors in nearly every building

reduce energy use by automatically switching lights off when a room is unoccupied.

# Renovations

#### Major Renovations to over 14 Buildings since 2007

#### Retrofitting old buildings with remotely monitored temperature regulation systems, new windows, light sensors, and other technologies helps keep occupant comfort high and energy use low. Hearn Plaza residence hall renovations increased efficiency by over 20% in each building (and water efficiency by 40%). Newer buildings like Angelou and Farrell Hall are equipped with the latest technology and efficiency measures.
